*Home Word Bound*

**Home Word Bound service brings library to patrons**  
Through a special outreach program called Home Word Bound, the Dundee Township Public Library delivers and picks up, at no cost, library materials to patrons in the district who are unable to visit the library due to illness or other physical limitation. Anything that can be checked out of the library can be delivered to a patron's door, including books (large print available), audio books, movies, CDs and magazines.

Those in need of the service can contact the library at (847) 428-3661. The process begins with a survey, so that library staff can get to know the patron and make recommendations. Information like favorite author, what type of genre they enjoy, and if they need a cassette or CD player to enjoy selections from the audio book collection is helpful in meeting the needs of the patron. Users with a home computer and access to the Internet can also search the library's database and make specific requests.
