Dundee Library hosts Dundee-Crown H.S. art show starting Mar. 16

East Dundee – Dundee-Crown High School art students have been channeling their creativity through various media and masterpieces this year and are ready to share it with the community as the Dundee Library welcomes their annual art display.

On Tuesday, Mar. 16 these talented artists will adorn the library with their work, which will include paintings, drawings, mixed media, collages, metals, sculpture, ceramics, computer generated art, prints, textiles, and weaving. The pieces will be on display until April 13.

Art teacher Kim Fuller is in her fourth year of teaching at Dundee-Crown and has worked with the students, faculty, and library to organize the show.

The awards will have been given by a panel of three judges with an art background. Refreshments will be served.
